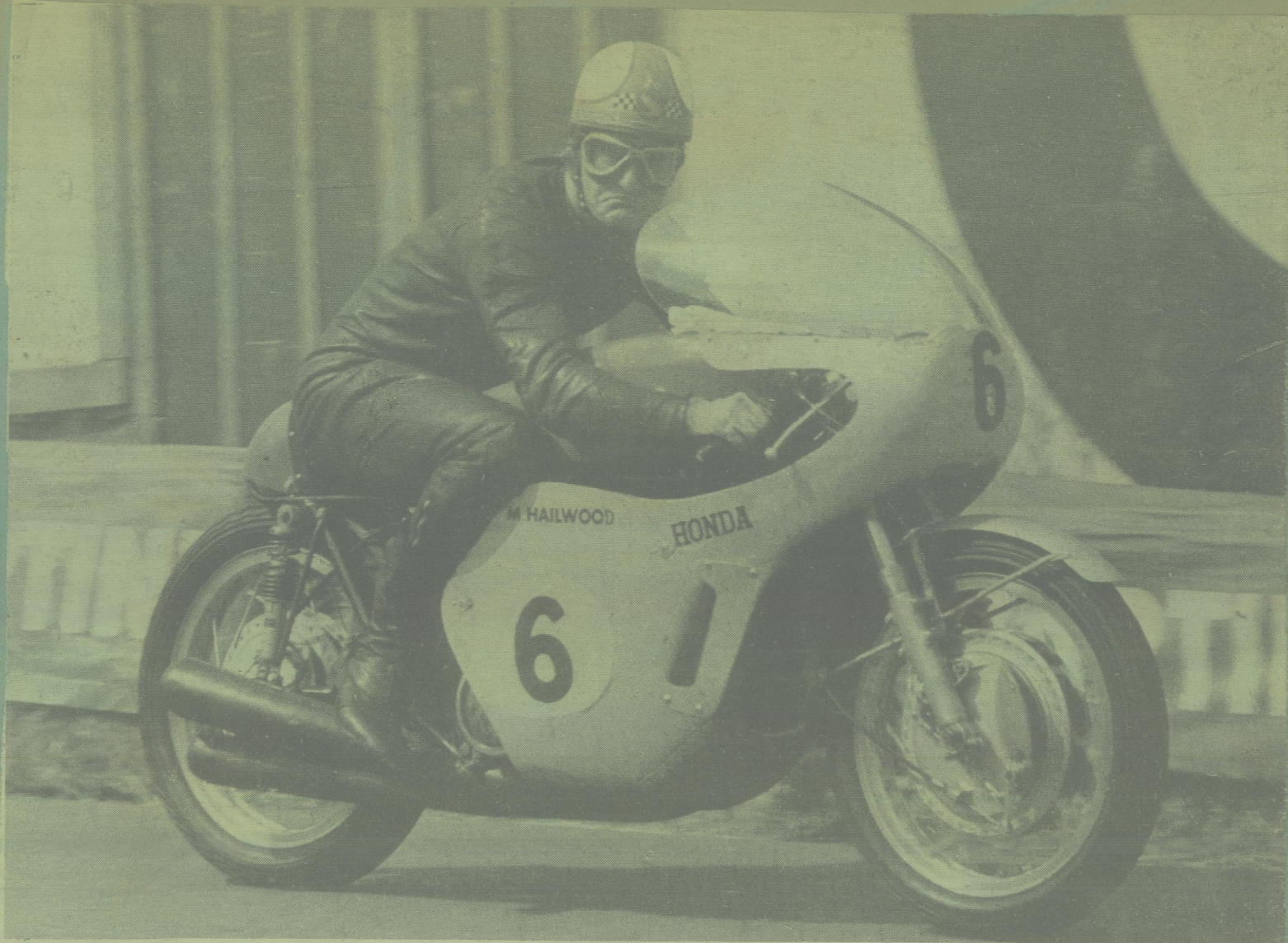

Rowland wins Hartle trial memorial

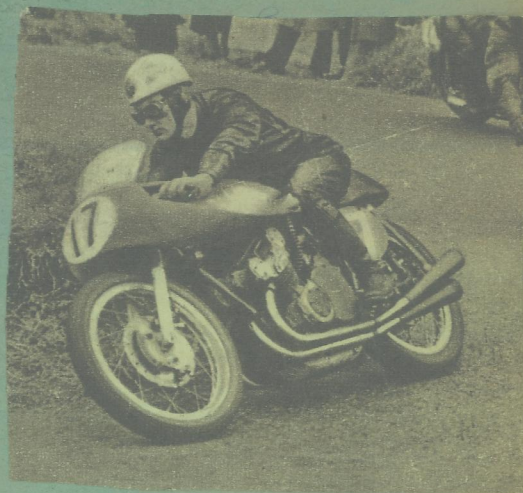
DAVE Rowland (250 Bultaco) had a relatively easy win in the Manchester 17 Club's John Hartle Memorial Trial, run over a snow-bound circuit on private ground at Longnor, Buxton, on Boxing Day.

At the end of five ten-section laps he had lost only 11 marks, just half as many as runner-up Mick Bowers (175

BSA), who was followed closely by club official John Roberts (125 Sprite) and veteran Eric Adcock (250 Dot).

Walter Bulloch (500 BSA) proved the best of the seven chair-men, beating similarly mounted Gordon De Burgh by 11 marks. Centre champion Jack Matthews had a very off-day and finished down the field.
